Activity 1: Character Exploration

Objective: Delve deeply into the characters of Genesis 2 and explore their roles and significance.

Instructions:

1. Divide into groups of three. Assign each group one character: Adam, Eve, or God.
2. Each group discusses their assigned character's role and significance in Genesis 2.

Roles:

- Facilitator: Guides the discussion and ensures everyone participates.
- Note-taker: Records key points and insights from the discussion.
- Reporter: Shares a summary of the discussion with the larger group.

Discussion Prompts:

Activity 2: Creating a Modern Parable

Roles:

- Storyteller: Leads the creative process and narrative development.
- Scribe: Writes down the parable as it's developed.
- Illustrator: Suggests visual or symbolic elements to enhance storytelling.
- Presenter: Shares the parable with the entire class.

Discussion Prompts:

- What lesson from Genesis 2 do we want to convey?
- How can we adapt this lesson to be relevant today?
- What characters and settings will best communicate our message?

Participation:

Students contribute ideas for character, setting, and plot within the parable.

Activity 3: Symbolism and Imagery Discussion

Objective: Understand and interpret the symbols and imagery used in Genesis 2.

Instructions:

1. Split into groups of five.
2. Each group analyzes a specific symbolic or image-rich part of the text (e.g., the Garden of Eden, the Tree of Knowledge, the creation of Eve).

Roles:

- Symbol Analyst: Identifies and explains the significance of the symbol or image.
- Context Coder: Places the symbol within the larger narrative and cultural context.
- Questioner: Develops questions to probe deeper understanding.
- Synthesizer: Connects the group's findings to broader themes in Genesis.
- Debater: Prepares to discuss different interpretations with the group.

Discussion Prompts:

- What does this symbol/image represent?
- How does it contribute to the overall message of Genesis 2?
- Are there modern equivalents or interpretations of this symbol?

Participation:

Each member presents their perspective, followed by a round-table discussion to reach a consensus.
