Game 1: Leviticus Role-play Relay

Players: 6-10

Materials Needed: Simple costumes (robes, fabric for turbans), paper crowns, a small altar made of cardboard, printed or drawn animals representing offerings (lambs, rams, etc.), and a script with speaking parts from Leviticus 8.

Setup: Arrange a play area where children can easily move from one place to another, creating stations for each part of the Leviticus 8 ceremony. Have a few costumes ready for the role-players.

Instructions:

1. Divide the players into small groups and assign each group a part of the Leviticus 8 ceremony, such as dressing the priests, preparing the altar, or presenting the offerings.
2. Each group receives a short script with dialogue and actions related to their scene.
3. Groups practice their scenes for a few minutes, then perform them in sequence as a live-action relay.
4. Encourage students to use the costumes and props to make the ceremony come alive as they perform each part.
5. After all the scenes, gather together to briefly discuss what they learned about the significance of the ceremonies.

How it reinforces the lesson: This game allows children to physically act out the rituals described in Leviticus 8, providing them with a tangible understanding of the historical and religious importance of the priests' ordination.

Game 2: Leviticus Obstacle Course

Players: 8-12

Materials Needed: Cones or markers to create an obstacle course, cards with challenges or trivia questions related to Leviticus 8, and a timer.

Setup: Design an obstacle course with stations. Each station should include a brief challenge related to Leviticus, such as matching offerings with their descriptions or answering a trivia question.

Instructions:

1. Players form two teams and line up at the starting point of the obstacle course.
2. One player from each team runs through the course, completing challenges at each station, such as answering questions or matching items.
3. After completing the course, they return to the start and tag the next teammate.
4. The first team to have all members complete the obstacle course wins.
5. As a group, discuss the importance of each type of offering and activity featured in the course.

How it reinforces the lesson: This game reviews key components of Leviticus 8 in an energetic way, helping students internalize different offerings and elements of the priestly ordination ceremony.

Game 3: Leviticus Bingo

Players: 4-10

Materials Needed: Bingo cards with words and images from Leviticus 8 (like "Moses," "ordination," "oil," "altar"), some stickers or chips for marking the cards, and a calling card set with phrases or descriptions.

Setup: Each player receives a bingo card, and the calling cards are shuffled.

Instructions:

1. The leader draws a calling card and reads the word or phrase aloud.
2. Players look for the corresponding word or image on their bingo cards.
3. If players have it, they place a sticker or chip on the square.
4. The first player to get five in a row (horizontally, vertically, or diagonally) wins and yells "Bingo!"
5. After someone wins, review all called phrases or words, discussing their role in Leviticus 8.

How it reinforces the lesson: Leviticus Bingo uses the engaging format of bingo to reinforce key terms and concepts from the chapter, promoting recall and understanding through repetition and visual association.
