Songs

1. "Samuel Anoints David" (Paraphrased)

- Lyrics/Paraphrase:
 - "Just like Samuel anointed David, God's special job to do; Moses anointed Aaron, to serve and guide us through."
- Suggested Actions:
 - Pretend to pour oil over your head.
 - Point to the heart when saying "special job."
- Connection:
 - Similar to the anointing in both stories, emphasizing God choosing leaders for special roles.

2. "We Are Chosen"

- Lyrics/Paraphrase:
 - "Chosen to follow, chosen to lead; God gives us blessings, a promise we heed."
- Suggested Actions:
 - Use hand motions for "follow" and "lead."
 - Pretend to catch blessings falling from the sky.
- Connection:
 - Highlights the idea of being chosen and set apart, just like the priests in Leviticus.

Worship Activities

1. Anointing Role Play

- Description:
 - Students can use olive oil or lotion as a stand-in for the anointing oil.
 - Each student takes turns pretending to "anoint" a classmate, saying, "You are chosen by God."
- How it Connects:
 - Demonstrates the physical act of anointing, a key aspect of Leviticus 8, making the concept more tangible.

2. Priestly Garments Craft

- Description:
 - Create simple "priestly garments" using paper vests and markers, letting students decorate their garments with symbols like ephods and breastpieces.
- How it Connects:
 - Helps students visualize the special role and attire of priests, understanding their unique service to God.

3. Blessing Hand Motions

- Description:
 - Teach students a simple blessing motion with their hands, starting with hands closed and opening them wide.
 - Accompany with "May God bless and keep you" as you open your hands.
- How it Connects:
 - Connects to the idea of blessings and the priests' role in giving blessings.

4. "Holy Service" Chant

- Description:
- Create a simple chant: "Holy hands, holy hearts, serving God, set apart!"
- Repeat with various rhythmic claps.
- Connection:
- Emphasizes holiness and being set apart for God's service, reinforcing the concept of consecration.

These activities and songs help students grasp the concept of being chosen and set apart for God's special purposes, as illustrated in Leviticus 8.
