Song Recommendation:

Paraphrased Lyrics:

Worship Activity:

Activity: Listen and Draw

- Objective: Help students understand the importance of listening to God's instructions.
- Materials: Paper and crayons/colored pencils.
- Instructions:
 - Read a simplified story of Nadab and Abihu from Leviticus 10 to the children.
 - Ask them to draw a picture representing the story, focusing on what it means to listen to God's way.
 - As they draw, play "God's Way is the Best Way" softly in the background to reinforce the message.

Connection to Lesson:
