Hands-On Craft: "Guidelines Scroll"

Materials List:

- Brown construction paper
- Wooden dowels or craft sticks (2 per student)
- Yarn or string
- Crayons or markers
- Glue stick
- Scissors
- Ruler
- Hole puncher
- Copies of paraphrased rules from Leviticus 20 (age-appropriate version)

Step-by-Step Instructions:

1. Prepare the Scroll:

- Give each student a sheet of brown construction paper.
- Using a ruler, guide students to cut the paper into a long rectangle, roughly 10 inches wide by 7 inches tall. This will form the scroll.

2. Write Guidelines:

- Instruct students to choose a few key guidelines from the paraphrased Leviticus 20 content and write them on their paper with crayons or markers. Encourage them to illustrate around or next to these rules to make them visually appealing and personally meaningful.

3. Assemble the Scroll:

- Glue a wooden dowel or craft stick to each of the shorter ends of the paper so that about an inch of the stick extends past each side.
- Once the glue is dry, carefully roll each end of the paper around the dowel towards the center to create the scroll effect.

4. Finish the Scroll:

- Use a hole puncher to create a hole near the edge of each dowel.
- Tie a piece of yarn or string through one of the punched holes. Wind it around both sticks, securing it by tying a bow or knot to hold the scroll closed.

5. Reflect and Share:

- Have each student share one interesting aspect or illustration from their scroll with the class.

Reinforcing the Lesson:

This activity helps students internalize and reflect on specific guidelines by creatively expressing them on their own personal scrolls. As they choose which guidelines to highlight and add illustrations, they are encouraged to engage thoughtfully with the teaching of respect and moral behavior, which are central themes in Leviticus 20. The act of creating and sharing their scrolls reinforces the community aspect of understanding and adhering to shared rules.
