Slide 1: Title Slide

- Title: "The Story of 2 Samuel 2: David Becomes King of Judah"
- Visual: An illustrated map of ancient Israel, highlighting the tribes and key locations (Hebron and Gibeon).
- Caption: "Discover the early reign of King David!"

Slide 2: David Anointed as King of Judah
